All work is difficult! No matter what occupation a person holds, it tends to carry with it many difficulties. Every job boils down to specific, often tedious and difficult tasks that are not always enjoyable. When people are engaged in these difficult parts of work, it is easy to ask oneself the following questions: Couldn't I be someplace better? Couldn't I be making more money doing something else? Does anyone really appreciate what I am doing? Is this work really making a difference in the world? Sometimes the difficulties of work and the questions that follow can become destructive to people. Many people become unfulfilled, cynical, unproductive, and sometimes self-destructive, moving from job to job, unable to find fulfillment.

There was definitely a period of time when I was very much like this in my work life—drifting from job to job, constantly searching for the perfect one, never finding it. Until the day that I came to an essential understanding...that my work is not my calling. My calling is to be a disciple of our Lord Jesus Christ, and my work is done as a reflection of my calling. Meaning that my life is not driven by or given worth by the work that I do, but by the way that I do it, as a disciple of Christ.

The Apostle Paul says “So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do it all to the glory of God”(1 Corinthians 10:31). Notice that this text does not say “do spiritual things, or even church related activities to God’s glory.” No, it stresses to do “ALL” things to the honor and glory of God. Our hard work brings God pleasure if we are doing it for God’s glory. Living out our calling as disciples means that no matter what work we find ourselves in, or the difficulties that come with it, we must work to the best of our abilities because it glorifies God, and through this we are given our worth. Therefore, if we are working for God in all things, we should enjoy the tasks that have been given to us, and the opportunities to bless others, customers and colleagues alike, regardless of the difficulties.

Every day we wake up with a question to ask. Who am I giving glory to today? We can choose to give glory to no one, and go through our daily toil with dread and indifference. Life will seem quite boring. We can decide to give glory to ourselves and show off all our abilities, only to discover that sooner or later we are very lonely and unfulfilled. Or we can give glory to God and start enjoying God’s company in everything we do. If this is your choice, before you even realize it, the destructive questions will fade away and you will start to enjoy your work. You will become excited about the possibilities your work offers you. You will find fulfillment in what you have produced, and eventually, the difficulties of work, although still difficult, will become more bearable.

*Glory be to the Lord our God, Jesus the Christ. Amen.*

All accounts at NBMC have been audited and found to be balanced and in good order. Thank you to the treasurers for doing an outstanding job at record keeping.

The good news is that we used less money from the McPherson principle to pay our bills which means that giving/tithing was up in 2025. The sad news is that we ended the year a little bit in the red. No worries, all bills were paid and budget will be balanced in 2026.

Just a reminder we are now in the Lenten season and once again are asking for 30 Pieces of Silver as a sacrificial giving. This year the money will go to the Unborn. See more about this elsewhere in the newsletter.

The church is also accepting donations to help defray the cost of the new carpet that will be placed in the sanctuary. In the past three (3) weeks over \$400 has been donated. Thank you for your extravagant generosity.

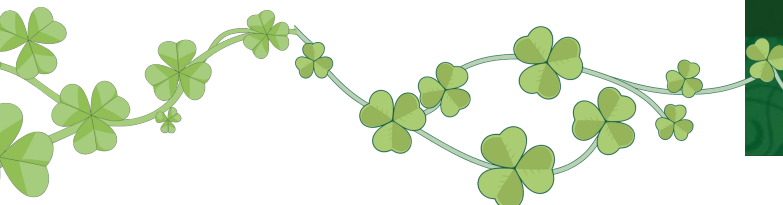

# 30 Pieces of Silver Program

**PreBorn!**

**A Life Worth Saving**

Because every heartbeat is a gift from God.

**Turn in your donations on Palm Sunday**

The church's "30 Pieces of Silver" program is a meaningful initiative that encourages congregants to engage in charitable giving during the Lenten season. Participants can pick up a small burlap sack from the church and fill it with spare change until Palm Sunday. This simple yet impactful act of collecting loose coins symbolizes the biblical story of Judas Iscariot's betrayal and transforms it into an opportunity for generosity and support. On Palm Sunday, the collected funds are turned over to the church, which has chosen to donate the proceeds to "PreBorn!"—a ministry dedicated to providing free ultrasounds to expectant mothers. The goal is to increase the likelihood that mothers, upon seeing an image of their baby, will choose to continue their pregnancy.

This program not only serves as a reminder of the power of giving but also directly supports a cause that aligns with the church's values. By participating, individuals contribute to a life-affirming mission that offers hope and clarity to mothers in need. The initiative exemplifies how small, collective actions can lead to significant impact, demonstrating the church's commitment to life and compassion.

# HOLY WEEK

*at New Brighton*



Holy Week is full of powerful “surface” moments — palm branches, the upper room, Gethsemane, the cross — but beneath the surface are incredible biblical connections. Jesus enters Jerusalem as the Lamb to be examined, celebrates Passover and reveals Himself as its fulfillment, prays over the “cup” of judgment in Gethsemane, and is crucified during Passover as the true Lamb of God. Even small details (hyssop, unbroken bones, the torn veil, the crown of thorns) echo earlier Scriptures.

Holy Week isn't just the story of Jesus' final days before the cross — it's the moment the whole Bible's storyline converges in Him. Join us this entire Lenten season as we explore the profound selflessness and love that culminated at the cross - and the royal triumph that walked out of the grave.



# Palm Sunday

Join us on March 29 for 1 Service at 11am

Palm Sunday marks Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of Holy Week. As He rode into the city on a donkey, crowds welcomed Him with palm branches and shouted, "Hosanna!" ("Save now!"), recognizing Him as the promised King and Messiah. This fulfilled prophecy (Zechariah 9:9) and revealed that Jesus was indeed the King — but He came in humility and peace, not as a political conqueror. The same city that welcomed Him with praise would soon turn against Him.

Palm Sunday reminds us that people can celebrate Jesus for what they want Him to do, while missing what He actually came to do. Many wanted freedom from Rome, but Jesus came first to bring freedom from sin. It is a day of praise, but also a day that invites us to examine our own hearts: do we follow Jesus only when He matches our expectations, or do we trust Him as Lord even when His ways are different than ours?



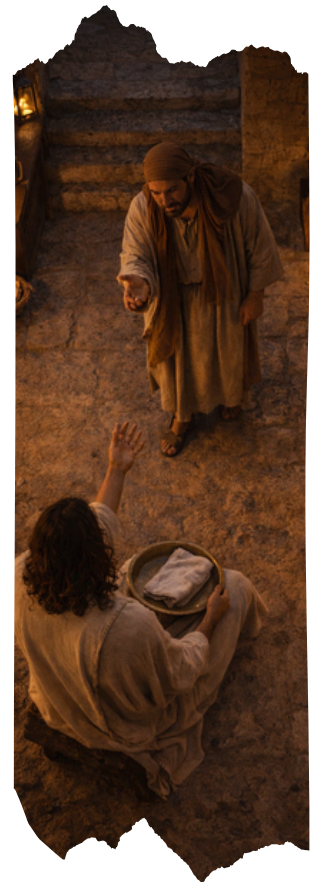
# Maundy Thursday

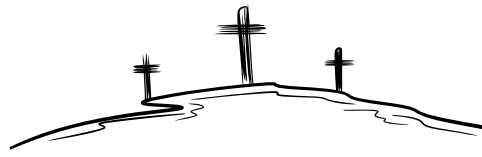


Join us on April 2 for 1 Service at 7pm

Maundy Thursday remembers the night Jesus shared the Last Supper with His disciples before His arrest. During this Passover meal, Jesus gave the bread and cup new meaning, pointing to His body and blood and establishing what we now call Communion or the Lord's Supper. He also washed His disciples' feet, taking the place of a servant and giving them a powerful example of humility, love, and sacrificial service. The word Maundy comes from a word meaning "command," referring to Jesus' command to love one another.

This night also includes some of the most intimate and painful moments of Holy Week. Jesus spoke tenderly to His disciples, warned them of what was coming, and then went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray in deep anguish. There, He submitted fully to the Father's will, even as He faced the coming suffering of the cross. Maundy Thursday shows us both the heart of Jesus and the cost of discipleship: love, surrender, and faithfulness in the face of darkness.





# Good Friday

Join us on April 3 for 1 Service at 7pm

Good Friday is the day we remember the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. After being betrayed, arrested, falsely accused, and condemned, Jesus was beaten, mocked, and led to the cross. Though He was innocent, He willingly suffered and died in our place, bearing the penalty for sin. What looked like defeat was actually the fulfillment of God's redemptive plan. Jesus, the Lamb of God, gave His life so that we might be forgiven and reconciled to the Father.

It is called "Good" Friday not because the suffering was good, but because of what Christ accomplished through it. At the cross, God's justice and mercy met. Jesus took upon Himself the judgment we deserved, and through His sacrifice the way was opened for salvation. Good Friday invites us to pause in reverence, gratitude, and repentance, remembering the depth of Christ's love: "He loved me and gave Himself for me."

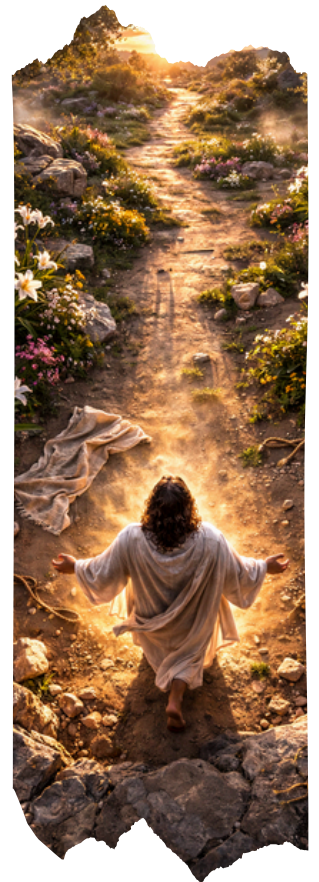
# Easter Sunday



Join us on April 5 for 1 Service at 11am

Resurrection Sunday celebrates the victorious resurrection of Jesus from the dead. On the third day after His crucifixion, the tomb was found empty, and Jesus appeared alive to His followers. The resurrection is the cornerstone of the Christian faith — it confirms that Jesus is who He claimed to be, that His sacrifice was accepted, and that sin and death were defeated. The sorrow of Good Friday gives way to joy, hope, and triumph.

Easter is not simply a celebration of life after death in a general sense; it is the declaration that Jesus Christ is risen indeed and reigns as Lord. Because He lives, we have real hope, forgiveness, and the promise of eternal life. Resurrection Sunday calls the church to rejoice boldly and to live as resurrection people — people marked by faith, hope, and the transforming power of the living Christ.
