Ancient and Real Communion: Part 2

In our church, we often celebrate Communion by a method called intinction. This simply means that each person comes forward, receives the bread, and then dips it into the cup before partaking. While there are many ways the Church has shared in this holy meal through the centuries, intinction has a long history and a special significance that I believe fits well within our Methodist understanding of Communion.

Historically, the earliest Christians received both the bread and wine during Communion, just as Jesus first shared it with His disciples in the Upper Room. As centuries passed, concerns about spilling or mishandling the blood of Christ, led to offering the bread alone to the congregation, while the priest consumed the cup on behalf of the people (Council of Constance 1415). This meant the laity no longer shared in both elements. The Reformers, including John Wesley, objected to this practice, believing that Christ commanded His disciples to “take and eat... take and drink” (Matthew 26:26–27). They insisted that the fullness of the Sacrament should be restored to the people of God (Articles of Religion of the Methodist Church 1784 article XVIII). Intinction then developed as a simple and reverent way to safeguard both elements while ensuring that every believer partakes of Christ’s body and blood. By dipping the bread into the cup, the church guards the unity of the body and blood, and follows Christ’s command that believers share fully in His sacrifice.

On a practical level, intinction also points to the personal nature of the meal. We all come to one loaf and one cup, just as Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 10:17: “Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf.” Rather than being handed small individual servings that can feel separated, we are reminded that we are bound together in Christ through His one body.

But there is a deeper reason why I, as a pastor prefer this practice. Every time I present the Communion, and witness each one of you step forward, I am reminded that I know many of your stories—the burdens you carry, the trials you endure, the griefs and struggles on your hearts. >>> **Cont on page 2**



I have prayed with you in hospital rooms, counseled you in difficult seasons, and praised God with you in times of healing and joy. And in that moment of Communion, as each of you takes the bread, and dips it into the cup, it is a sign that Christ Himself meets you personally in all of those moments...and in that moment I can, in a special way, somehow see or feel a glimpse of our ultimate healing in Christ. The bread and cup proclaim His broken body and shed blood, not only for forgiveness of our sins, but also to point us to a promised day when every sorrow, sickness, and struggle will be overcome. As Revelation 21:4 says, “He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.” Therefore, when you dip the bread into the cup and partake of the goodness of the Lord, remember...your healing is secure in Christ, and your story is not finished until He makes all things new.

Glory be to the Lord our God, Jesus the Christ. Amen.

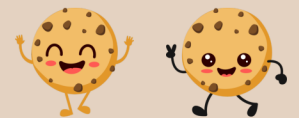

Have You Considered...

While you are creating your financial plan, have you considered leaving money to NBMC? If yes, the following article was created by AI. It has some basics steps, but it is suggested that you discuss it with your financial planner and lawyer first.

To leave money to a church, document your wishes in a will or trust, clearly identifying the church by its legal name and providing details on the gift's purpose and amount. Informing the church of your intentions helps avoid complications and ensures they can manage the gift. For larger gifts, a trust can offer greater control, and for smaller or routine gifts, a simple bequest in a will is sufficient.

Key Steps for a Planned Gift

1. **Reflect on Your Values:**

Consider which aspects of the church's work resonate most with your beliefs, such as youth education, community outreach, or preserving traditions.

2. **Choose Your Gift Method:**

- **Bequest in a Will:** A straightforward way to leave money to a church in your will.
- **Trust:** A trust provides more control and flexibility, especially for larger gifts, ensuring your assets are managed and distributed as you intend.
- **Designated Purpose:** Specify if you want the funds to support a particular ministry, project, or the general operating fund of the church.

3. **Document Your Intentions:**

A written will or trust is essential; verbal promises have no legal weight.

4. **Use the Church's Legal Name:**

Identify the beneficiary with their complete legal name, address, and tax identification number to prevent confusion.

5. **Notify the Organization:**

Inform the church of your intentions in advance. This allows them to accept and manage the gift responsibly, particularly if it involves specific conditions or requires ongoing maintenance, such as a property.

Why Make a Planned Gift?

- Support Future Ministries:

These gifts are investments in the church's long-term sustainability, providing funds for outreach, education, and other vital ministries.

- Strengthening the Community:

Planned gifts build lasting relationships and help sustain the church's work for generations to come.

Important Considerations

- Professional Assistance:

Seek professional legal and financial advice to ensure your plan is executed correctly and follows all formalities.

- Avoid Surprises:

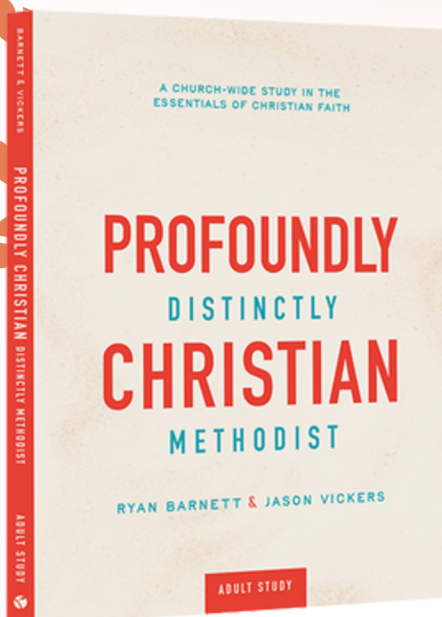
A gift that is unexpected or requires the church to take on new responsibilities can lead to complications.
